## KIMU VEKIBLU AT YESHIVA OHAVEI TORAH

Much has been said and written about the phenomenon of *bochurim* dedicating their *Purim* to raising funds for *tzedakah*. While the concept of fundraising is undoubtedly a noble one, the downsides are well known.

Often overlooked in the broader discussion of the pros and cons is the missed opportunity for a *bochur* to experience the *aliyah* that can be achieved through utilizing this day properly and maximizing the *ruchniyus* that can be gleaned from it.

This year, for the first time, Yeshiva Ohavei Torah of Riverdale took the initiative. The *menahel*, Rabbi Chaim Pechter, set a ground rule that any type of group collecting or the participation in any nonfamily parties where alcohol was served would not be allowed. Alternatively, the *yeshiva* would host a voluntary *leil Purim seder* on Wednesday night, the first night of *Purim*, at the BTU Bais Medrash in Passaic, with transportation provided for all participants to and from Passaic. A special ski trip scheduled for after *Purim* would be held for all *bochurim* who participated in this *seder*. The trip would be followed by a barbecue at

Rabbi Pechter's home.

Immediately after *krias hamegillah*, Rabbi Pechter and the staff of *rabbeim* set out for Passaic, wondering how many brave souls would actually take them up on the offer. Not long after their arrival in Passaic, the transportation vehicles arranged by the *yeshiva* began pulling in. They came from Passaic, Riverdale, Monsey, the West Side, Queens, and Lakewood.

With 67 out of the yeshiva's 74 talmidim packing the bais medrash, along with the entire hanhalah, the pulsating energy and reverberating kol Torah quickly spilled over onto the streets, attracting the curiosity of local neighbors. Walking into the bais medrash, they were blown away by the sight: costume-clad bochurim, on Purim night, many in full Purim regalia, plugging away at their Gemaros, without a care in the world. The elevated aura of the evening added a special uplifting dynamic to the geshmak of the learning. The scene looked so other-worldly, so Olam Habadig, that they just stood there mesmerized. They offered sponsorships, anything to own a share in this.

After a lively hour-plus *seder*, the *bochurim* sat down to lavish *Purim tish* with Rabbi Pechter. The singing and the uplifting *matzav* at the *tish* brought to the fore the elevated *ruchniyudige* fulfillment experienced by the *bochurim*. The singing and dancing lasted until 1 a.m.

One week later, on Thursday morning, Yeshiva Ohavei Torah began early with a special pre-Shacharis seder. Immediately after davening, the boys headed out to a full day ski trip on the slopes. Vendors for the trip, like the charter bus company and the food suppliers, offered generous discounts for the privilege of having a share in the zechus of this project. As promised, the trip was followed by a beautiful barbecue and kumzitz at Rabbi Pechter's home in Monsey.

Reflecting on the beautiful success of this initiative, parents pointed to Yeshiva Ohavei Torah's hallmark of having a steady finger on the pulse the world in which *bochurim* are growing up and doing whatever it takes to maximize their growth into healthy and well-rounded *bnei Torah*.
